2. General Information

The Department of Informatics and Telecommunications actively participates in the Erasmus+ student and staff mobility program (<https://piro.uoi.gr/>), which is centrally managed by the corresponding service of the University of Ioannina (<https://piro.uoi.gr/erasmus/37/erasmus>).

Through the Erasmus+ program, postgraduate students are given the opportunity to move for studies to Universities that maintain bilateral agreements with the Department of Informatics and Telecommunications. Students participating in mobility programs may attend part of their study program or carry out part of their postgraduate thesis work in one of the countries of the European Union.

During meeting no. 99/31-05-2023, the Department of Informatics and Telecommunications updated the eligibility criteria for candidate students of the Department for ERASMUS+ Study scholarships.

The Department considers that ERASMUS+ Study scholarships should contribute to the student's academic progress while simultaneously promoting a positive reputation and image of the Department.

2. Candidate Postgraduate Students for the ERASMUS+ Study Program

2.1 Initial Requirements

If the candidate is a student of:	Requirements: The student may owe:
i). 2nd semester	At most 1 course from the first semester
ii). 3rd semester	At most 2 courses from the second semester and no courses from the first semester

2.2 Language Requirements

According to general guidelines, the minimum language proficiency level for learning mobility activities is defined as level B2 (Lower) in English (or, where applicable, French or German).

The host university defines corresponding requirements on a case-by-case basis (e.g., French, German, etc.). Therefore, outgoing students should obtain relevant information from the host university and comply with these requirements.

In all cases, the provisions of the regulations of the Department of International Relations of the University of Ioannina also apply.

2.3 Ranking of Applicant Postgraduate Students

During meeting no. 99/31-05-2023, the Department of Informatics and Telecommunications decided that the ranking by the ERASMUS Committee for mobility for studies or Placement/Traineeship with an ERASMUS+ scholarship shall take into account the following criteria:

1. The grade point average of the courses of the Postgraduate Study Program at the time of application submission.
2. The semester of study in the Postgraduate Study Program. Students in more advanced semesters of study will be given priority.

If the mobility for studies or placement includes the preparation of a postgraduate thesis, the student must also submit to the ERASMUS Committee the approval of the supervising professor.

In the event of a tie, a draw shall take place among the tied applications for the available positions.

3. Recognition of Study Period

The study period abroad is fully recognized. Specifically, the Department of Informatics and Telecommunications of the University of Ioannina commits to ensuring recognition of the study period abroad (including examinations and other forms of assessment) as a substitute for a corresponding study period at the home institution (likewise including examinations or other forms of assessment).

The Erasmus+ student is provided with a written and signed Learning Agreement for Studies, the content of which has been agreed in advance between the student, the host institution, and the Department of Informatics and Telecommunications regarding the content and requirements of the courses to be attended at the host institution or the research work (postgraduate diploma thesis) to be carried out.

It is recommended that the Learning Agreement include courses from the semester during which the student studies abroad.

Only in cases where this is particularly difficult or impossible, and in order to complete the required workload (approximately 30 ECTS credits), and only after the agreement of both the Departmental Coordinator and the responsible professors, may a limited number of outstanding courses from previous semesters be accepted.

A prerequisite for the proper selection of the courses included in the Learning Agreement is knowledge of the study program of the host university (through its website).

The content of the courses selected by the student must correspond to courses of similar content offered by the Department of Informatics and Telecommunications, although it is not necessary for them to be identical.

Finally, students should be aware that once their studies abroad begin, they will be entitled to modify their study program only in exceptional cases. For this reason, they should be particularly careful when formulating their study program.
